Chue is pronounced CHEW. It means *bell* and can be a name for a girl or a boy.

Dawb is pronounced DUH, with a rising tone. It means *white* and can be a name for a girl or a boy.

Hmong is pronounced MOHNG. The word refers to a people, an ethnic minority, from Southeast Asia. Starting in 1975, many Hmong families came to the United States as refugees of war.

Lei is pronounced LAY. It is a name for a girl or a boy.

me naib is pronounced MEE NYE with a rising tone at the end. It is a term of endearment for a child, similar to "my dear" or "my darling."

phim nyu vais is pronounced PEE NYU VYE. The word refers to an evil spirit that causes sickness and death.

pog ntxoog is pronounced BAH TXHONG. The word refers to a female jungle spirit who was once human and is the size of a child.
